- 1. A, B, C and D belong to a family whose members are all gases. A is commonly used in advertising signs. B was first discovered on our sun and is used in balloons. C was used to make the first compounds of the group. D is the group member present in the largest amount in air.
- 2. E and F are members of a family containing both gases and solids. E is diatomic and is the largest component of the air we breath. F is a metalloid and is a dangerous poison.
- 3. G, H and I belong to the most active group of metals. G is a member of the first period to contain 18 elements. H is a radioactive metal and the most active of all metals. I is named from the Latin word for "red".
- 4. J, K and L belong to the same family and are all metals. A compound of J is a major component of bones and teeth. K is used in highway flares and to produce light in flashbulbs. L is radioactive.
- 5. M is a gas but is similar in some properties to G, H and I.
- 6. N, O and P are very active nonmetals. N is a liquid and O is a nonradioactive solid. P is the most chemically reactive of all the elements.
- 7. Q, R, S and T are in different groups but the same period. Q is a gas used to disinfect water. R is a yellow nonmetallic solid. S is a metalloid used in computer chips. T is a metal of low density used in the kitchen.
- 8. U, V, W and X are transition elements. U is an excellent conductor of electricity and is used for wiring and cookware. V is a liquid at room temperature. W is used mostly for steelmaking. X once used mainly in coins, is now primarily used in expensive jewelry.
- 9. Y is an actinide used as the major nuclear fuel. Z is named for the creator of the Periodic Table.
